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#### 1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 To verify that proper safeguards and precautions have been taken to minimize the possibility of personnel injury and property damage associated with smoking.
- 1.2 To provide requirements for site preparation and communications required between all personnel and the Safety Department at the Galveston Bay Refinery (GBR).

## 2.0 Scope

- 2.1 This practice applies to all Marathon Petroleum Company (MPC) employees, contractors, subcontractors and visitors at GBR.
- 2.2 This practice applies to designated smoking areas as indicated in Attachment A.
- 2.3 This practice also applies to temporary smoking areas that are established in accordance with instructions contained below in section 3.3 Temporary Smoking Areas.

#### 3.0 Procedure

### 3.1 General Requirements

- 3.1.1 No smoking in any form is allowed inside the plant-controlled gates, or in any company vehicle, except:
  - 3.1.1.1 Where the site has designated permanent smoking areas as indicated in Attachment A.
  - 3.1.1.2 Where the site has established temporary smoking areas meeting the requirements of this procedure.

#### 3.2 Permanent Smoking Areas

#### 3.2.1 Requirements

- 3.2.1.1 **Surface –** smoking area surfaces and the walkways to and from them shall be level and free of any tripping hazards such as holes, loose gravel, curbs, etc.
- 3.2.1.2 **Fire extinguisher –** minimum 5# Class ABC extinguisher shall be at each location, be visible, mounted at least 4 inches above the ground, and have unrestricted access to it within the smoking area.
- 3.2.1.3 **Butt Cans –** shall be provided at each location, be visible and have unrestricted access to prevent discard of smoking material to grade.
- 3.2.1.4 **Signage –** each smoking area shall have signage denoting it as a smoking area.
- 3.2.1.5 **Sewers –** smoke areas shall be established at a minimum of 35 feet away from an open sewer.
- 3.2.1.6 **Outside Classified Hazardous Areas** smoking areas are prohibited in classified hazardous areas.

#### 3.2.2 Roles and Responsibilities

#### 3.2.2.1 Owning Department

3.2.2.1.1 Inspect smoking area locations to ensure that all requirements of this procedure are in place and identify any hazards associated with its use on a periodic basis.

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- 3.2.2.1.2 Inspect fire extinguishers monthly.
- 3.2.2.1.3 Notify personnel that are in the smoking area of any refinery emergency or changes in conditions that could affect the smoking area.
- 3.2.2.2 Users
  - 3.2.2.2.1 Discard only smoking materials in "Butt Cans".
  - 3.2.2.2.2 Ensure discarded smoking materials are completely extinguished.
  - 3.2.2.2.3 Extinguish smoking materials and report to a safe muster point in the event of a refinery or unit emergency that affects the smoking area or if instructed to do so by MPC employees.
  - 3.2.2.2.4 Do not discard smoking materials or any other trash onto the ground.

## 3.3 Temporary Smoking Areas

- 3.3.1 Requirements
  - 3.3.1.1 **Safe Work Permit** requires a safe work permit for unattended hot work.
  - 3.3.1.2 **Barricades** must be surrounded on all sides and have a designated entry/exit. Permanent structures that prevent entry may be used as part of the barricade. Portable / temporary scaffolding shall be self- supporting and designed to minimize tripping hazards.
  - 3.3.1.3 **Surface –** smoking area surfaces and the walkways to and from them shall be level and free of any tripping hazards such as holes, loose gravel, curbs, etc.
  - 3.3.1.4 **Fire extinguisher –** minimum 5# Class ABC extinguisher shall be at each location, mounted at least 4 inches above the ground, be visible and have unrestricted access to it within the smoking area.
  - 3.3.1.5 **Butt Cans –** shall be provided at each location, be visible and have unrestricted access to prevent discard of smoking material to grade.
  - 3.3.1.6 **Signage –** each smoking area shall have signage denoting it as a smoking area.
  - 3.3.1.7 **Sewers –** smoke areas shall be established at a minimum of 35 feet away from an open sewer.
  - 3.3.1.8 **Outside Classified Hazardous Areas** smoking areas are prohibited in classified hazardous areas,
- 3.3.2 Roles and Responsibilities
  - 3.3.2.1 Safety
    - 3.3.2.1.1 Approve temporary smoking area locations.
      - 3.3.2.1.1.1 If the temporary smoking area location is associated with a tent siting, the location should be addressed as part of the tent siting MOC.
    - 3.3.2.1.2 Verify all requirements of this procedure are in place once erected.
  - 3.3.2.2 Owning Department

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- 3.3.2.2.2 Issue safe work permit for temporary smoking area locations.
- 3.3.2.2.3 Verify requirements of this procedure are in place once erected.
- 3.3.2.2.4 Inspect smoking area locations to ensure that all requirements of this procedure are in place and identify any hazards associated with its use on a periodic basis.
- 3.3.2.2.5 Inspect fire extinguishers monthly.
- 3.3.2.2.6 Notify personnel that are in the smoking area of any refinery emergency or changes in conditions that could affect the smoking area.

## 3.3.2.3 TAR Group

- Ensure that all smoking areas are properly constructed per the requirements of this procedure (e.g., barricades, surfaces, appropriate signage, "Butt Cans", fire extinguisher etc.).
- 3.3.2.3.2 Inspect smoking area locations to ensure that all requirements of this procedure are in place and identify any hazards associated with its use on a daily basis.
- 3.3.2.3.3 Clean up the smoke area upon the completion of each work shift.
- 3.3.2.3.4 Completely dismantle the temporary smoking area and remove all of its components when no longer in use at the end of the TAR.

#### 3.3.2.4 Users

- 3.3.2.4.1 Discard only smoking materials in "Butt Cans".
- 3.3.2.4.2 Ensure discarded smoking materials are completely extinguished.
- 3.3.2.4.3 Extinguish smoking materials and report to a safe muster point in the event of a refinery or unit emergency that affects the smoking area or if instructed to do so by MPC employees.
- 3.3.2.4.4 Do not discard smoking materials or any other trash onto the ground.
- 3.3.2.4.5 Smoking materials (cigarettes, e-cigarettes, pipes, cigars, matches and lighters) must not be taken into process areas and/or tank farm areas. They will need to be kept in vehicle, lunchbox or designated lunch area.
